For the last three years New Frontiers has been operating at a slight deficit, this has not been a problem due to the fact that we have a modest fund balance. In fiscal year 2016-17 we were under budget and over membership projections, therefore providing a small surplus as noted below.

Committee Highlights

Curriculum Committee

Margo Heaps, Co-Chair; Jennifer Wong, Co-Chair The Curriculum Committee role is to develop and oversee classes for each semester.

 During the 2016-17 school year, the curriculum committee planned and implemented a total



- of 175 classes for the Fall, Spring and Summer semesters to its members. Total enrollment for these classes totaled 4,879 with a 78% attendance rate.
- Many of our classes were presented by our own members. Other classes were presented by MCC Emeritus Faculty as well as well as by individuals who are experts in the legal, financial, health and arts industry.
- While a majority of our classes were held equally at the Red Mountain and Dobson campuses of Mesa Community College, we also held classes at non-MCC venues such as the Mesa Active Adult Center, Resurrection Church, Mesa Fire and Police Stations, Leisure World, Las Palmas, Apache Wells, The Orchards.
- This year the class offerings expanded in scope to include:
 - Political issues both current and past,
 - Arizona history, i.e., the Salt River, Ghost Towns
 - ➤ Homeopathic medicine, i.e., herbs, dietary supplements.
 - Documentaries such as Life After People and Mark Twain
 - Road trip to Cornville and Page Springs.

Membership Committee

The Membership Committee is responsible a variety of tasks that enhance and benefit the members.

Two open house events September 2016 and January 2017. Our partner in this event,



the Curriculum Committee, invited class facilitators and class presenters to receive guests' and members' questions about classes.

- Primary communications were through the quarterly eight page newsletters which were sent out via mail and/or digitally through email distribution.
